

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING  
MINUTES  
October 16, 2017**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bennett, Bradley, Schneider, Henry, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Adkins, and Attorney Roscoe Leslie. Residents Jean Cordrey, Nancy Springer, and Robert and Sandy Rose were also present.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve the minutes from the October 2nd regular meeting. A second was made by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5, which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor, so carried.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

The Sharptown Planning and Zoning held a public hearing earlier in the evening to hear comments on the proposed land subdivision plat for the solar project. They voted in favor of recommending the Commissioners approve the subdivision plat. Commissioner Bradley made a motion to approve the subdivision plat for the solar project land purchase, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

The Sustainable Growth committee will meet again on November 1<sup>st</sup>.

President Gosnell stated two positions on the Sharptown Board of Zoning Appeals needed to be filled. After discussion, two residents, Sandy Rose and Nancy Springer, in attendance of the meeting stated they would be interested in serving. Commissioner Schneider made a motion to appoint Sandy Rose to the Board of Zoning Appeals, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried. Commissioner Bennett made a motion to appoint Nancy Springer to the Board of Zoning Appeals, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Bennett stated the Historical Commission decided to keep Heritage Day on the same date, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of September. Heritage Day 2018 will be held on September 15<sup>th</sup>.

President Gosnell stated the “Keys to the Town” have been ordered for the Heroes Haven banquet.

President Gosnell stated the chlorinator at the sewer plant has been replaced.

President Gosnell stated the smoke testing and sewer camera for the I&I study is tentatively scheduled for next week.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

President Gosnell stated the Town's Chevrolet S-10 pickup is in very bad shape and it's time to start thinking about replacing it. The Commissioners reviewed retired fleet vehicles for sale from Fastenal. After discussion, Commissioner Bennett suggested waiting to see if the Circuit Rider could find any grant money to purchase a truck for the Town. Everyone agreed to table the topic for the time being.

President Gosnell stated he, and the Mayors of Pittsville and Willards will be interviewing applicants for the Circuit Rider position on Thursday October 19<sup>th</sup>.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. There were none.

President Gosnell asked for public comments. Resident Nancy Springer stated there are a couple street lights out or blinking. President Gosnell stated we would get the pole numbers and report them to the electric company.

Commissioner Bradley made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 8:02 p.m.
