

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING  
MINUTES  
January 17, 2017**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:31p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bradley, Schneider, Henry, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, and Secretary Adkins. Commissioner Bennett was absent. Also present were Danica Schneider, Robert and Sandy Rose, Lt. Tim Robinson, and Pastor Jeff Dulis.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to approve the minutes from the January 3rd regular meeting. A second was made by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

Prior to the start of business, Lt. Tim Robinson reported on the police incidents in town for the last six months. Resident Sandy Rose discussed people speeding and driving distracted on Main Street in the mornings.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

The Dollar General is under contract with Farmers Bank of Willards to build a store at Pecan Corner. Superintendent White and Aaron Goller met with TK Construction to look at what is needed to complete the water and sewer work per the public works agreement.

The Commissioners reviewed an email update from Aaron Goller on the status of the solar project. Mr. and Mrs. Rose discussed the contract to purchase their land and the contract was signed.

The new dump truck is being worked on to pass inspection, the plow for the pickup should be repaired next week, and we received a shipment of road salt.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

The town received a letter from the Wicomico County Council to submit two names to be considered to be on the nominating committee for the elected school board. We will post a flyer to look for any volunteers.

President Gosnell stated he would like the town to join the Maryland Mayors Association as another way to network and build relationships with other municipalities. The dues are \$60 a year. Commissioner Bradley made a motion to join the MMA and was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell asked for public comments. Pastor Dulis stated he would like to hold the 6K Global Walk for Water again this year, on May 6<sup>th</sup>. The Commissioners asked that he bring in the route he plans on using. Commissioner Schneider motioned to allow the 6K walk/run and was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor so carried.

There were no other comments. Commissioner Bradley made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 8:04 p.m.
