

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING  
MINUTES  
February 4, 2019**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bennett, Bradley, Schneider, Henry, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Adkins, Superintendent White, Attorney Roscoe Leslie, Circuit Rider Joe Mangini, and resident Jean Cordrey.

Commissioner Bradley made a motion to approve the minutes from the January 7th regular meeting. A second was made by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4, 5, and 6, which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor, so carried.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

The Commissioners held a work session on January 23<sup>rd</sup> to discuss retirement and on street parking. Commissioner Bennett reported the town received a few options to choose from for an employee retirement plan and Clerk/Treasurer Schneider will be looking at budgeting options.

President Gosnell stated the Commissioners discussed the issue of people parking on the streets in town. One option is to pass an ordinance prohibiting on street parking and allowing the Sherriff's Department to write tickets while on patrol. The Commissioners reviewed a draft letter to send to residents and a letter sent in 2011 about the issue. The Commissioners agreed to send the drafted letter to residents to see if that will take care of the issue without having to create a new ordinance and Superintendent White will confirm with the fire department if they mind if the letter from 2011 also sent out again.

Secretary Adkins stated the paperwork for the generator grant has been submitted for reimbursement.

Clerk/Treasurer Schneider updated the Commissioners on the acquisition of 502 Nanticoke Street property. She stated she went to the County and paid what was owed. Dirk Widdowson will serve as the attorney who will handle this for us. He has sent out 2 notices to the owners address on file. Circuit Rider Mangini stated copies of the paperwork showing proof of purchase have been submitted to see if the grant funds can be disbursed before the acquisition is complete.

Circuit Rider Mangini stated he is working on a meeting to discuss options for the bulkhead.

President Gosnell stated he talked to Delegate Mautz about driving golf carts on town streets. The Commissioners agreed for President Gosnell to ask Delegate Mautz to begin the legislation process.

The Commissioners discussed what photograph to use in the Town year book ad at Mardela High School. They agreed to use a picture of the bridge.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Town Hall will be closed on February 18<sup>th</sup> in observance of Presidents Day. The next meeting will be held Tuesday February 19<sup>th</sup>.

The Commissioners reviewed a request for a credit on the water bill for 407 Main Street due to a leak. Commissioner Bennett made a motion to issue the standard sewer credit for 407 Main Street, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. Commissioner Schneider stated the 2019 Officers for Parks and Recreation will remain the same: Scott McMahon President, Mark Carroll Vice President, Pam Eskridge Secretary, and Dot Dickerson Treasurer. He reported that at the County Good Sports Awards ceremony Danica Schneider was awarded Player of the Year and Coach Danny Bailey was awarded Coach of the Year.

President Gosnell asked for public comments. Jean Cordrey asked if the golf cart ordinance would include 4-wheelers. President Gosnell stated he did not believe so but he would look into that. He believes it would be restricted to golf carts.

There were no other comments. Commissioner Bradley made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 8:01pm.
