

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING  
MINUTES  
March 16, 2020**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Henry, Schneider, Bennett, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Adkins, Attorney Mike Mathers, Superintendent White, and residents Mark Carroll and Nancy Springer. Commissioner Bradley was absent.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve the minutes from the February 18th regular meeting. A second was made by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

President Gosnell stated the meeting with SERCAP is scheduled for March 18<sup>th</sup>.

President Gosnell stated it may be possible to use Highway User money to replace sidewalks and if so it could be done in conjunction with paving the street.

Superintendent White reported the water tower painting has been completed. Suez will be in on March 18<sup>th</sup> to test if the paint has cured. If so, the tank will be sanitized, filled and the water will be tested. This all may not be complete until the end of the month.

Attorney Mathers stated he is working on an ordinance regarding 5G cellular towers in town. He asked if there were any areas were would not like them placed. After discussion, he will work on the ordinance to be acted on in the future if needed.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

The Commissioners reviewed a request to appoint Fran Ruark and Beau Spicer to the Historical Commission. Commissioner Henry made a motion to accept the appointments of Fran Ruark and Beau Spicer to the Historical Commission, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

The Commissioners reviewed appointments to the Parks and Recreation Commission:

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve all of the listed appointments to the Parks and Recreation Commission, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell stated the ESAM meeting has been cancelled.

President Gosnell stated due to the Coronavirus, the Town Hall will follow State and County guidelines and be closed to the public. The drive through will open to conduct business.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. Commissioner Schneider introduced Mark Carroll, President of the Parks and Recreation Commission. Mr. Carroll asked if anyone knew where the by-laws for the Parks and Recreation may be. After discussion it was suggested he contact Dot Dickerson or Ralph Cordrey to see if they know. Mr. Carroll also asked if it would be possible for him to have a key to the Town Hall. Commissioner Bennett made a motion to allow the President of the Parks and Recreation Commission to have a key to the Town Hall, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Bennett stated the Historical Commission is ordering pavers to be placed at the Main Street park, is seeking new members, and is looking into putting up banners in town, similar to the ones in Mardela Springs.

Superintendent White stated the sewer plant is coming along, they are using plant 2 to reseed plant 1. The nutrient management plan for this year is being worked on.

President Gosnell asked for public comment. There were none.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to adjourn the Commissioners meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 8:16 p.m.
