

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES
March 19, 2018**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bennett, Schneider, Henry, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, and Secretary Adkins. Also present were residents Jean Cordrey and Teresa Herring.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve the minutes from the March 5th regular meeting. A second was made by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

President Gosnell stated Delmarva Power is now scheduled to transfer the new service for the solar project on March 23rd, weather permitting.

Construction on the Dollar General is coming along. Installation of the new sewer line on State Street from Railway to Taylor Street is scheduled to begin in a couple weeks, along with the sewer line to the Dollar General store. Residents will be notified when the work is to begin.

The milling of School Street/Fourth Street is done and the paving and slurry will be done when County Roads finishes their work out at San Domingo.

Commissioner Bennett stated Circuit Rider Mangini has been sending out emails looking for grant opportunities for the Historical Commission building and found one he thinks we should try for; the application is due in June.

NEW BUSINESS:

President Gosnell stated the next ESAM meeting is April 19th at Arthur W. Perdue Stadium. Please rsvp to Secretary Adkins.

President Gosnell stated the fire hydrant in the area of Railway and Taylor Street is in need of replacement. His suggestion is to replace it now while the road will be torn up for the installation of the new sewer line. Commissioner Bennett made a motion to replace the fire hydrant, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. Commissioner Schneider stated at low tide he noticed the pilings around the new bridge appear to need some repairs made to them. President Gosnell stated he would find out who to contact about that.

Commissioner Bennett and Teresa Herring stated upcoming activities for the Historical Commission. On April 15th at 2pm Terry Cranell would be doing a presentation at the Asbury Community Center, admission is \$3. And a bake sale will be held on Saturday April 28th.

President Gosnell asked for public comments. There were none

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 7:50pm
