

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES
April 1, 2019**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bennett, Bradley, Schneider, and Henry, Superintendent White, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Adkins, Attorney Leslie, Circuit Rider Joe Mangini, Bunky Luffman, and residents Jean Cordrey and Nancy Springer.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to approve the minutes from the March 18th regular meeting. A second was made by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

Prior to the start of regular business, Bunky Luffman introduced himself to the Commissioners. He is working for Senator Andy Harris's office and stated if he can help with anything on the Federal level to please reach out to him.

OLD BUSINESS:

President Gosnell stated Tracey Gordy informed the Town the Critical Area Commission does not have the map ready yet for the update. Her opinion is for the town to wait and pass the ordinance and map changes together. The Commissioners agreed with her recommendation.

President Gosnell stated he, Superintendent White, Attorney Leslie, and Engineer Aaron Goller met with the County concerning the stormwater issues at Pecan Corner. The consensus of the meeting was there will be no CO's issued until the Town has received approval for the stormwater management plan. Attorney Leslie has sent a letter to the Kirk Kinnamon and the Farmers Bank of Willards informing them of the decision.

Circuit Rider Joe Mangini stated he has been working on a progress report for the 502 Nanticoke Street grant, but the system has been down. He stated he has looked into getting a grant to repair the bulkhead and has appointments scheduled to meet with marine contractors to get estimates for riprap. Mr. Mangini also stated the Town has been awarded the emergency grant to replacing the decking at the Cherry Beach pier, and is ready to be completed.

President Gosnell reminded the Commissioners of the work session scheduled for April 3rd to discuss employee retirement options.

President Gosnell stated he was informed that the paving on School Street is due to done in the coming weeks.

NEW BUSINESS:

President Gosnell stated the invitation for the April 28th ESAM meeting has arrived. Please RSVP to Secretary Adkins.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. Commissioner Schneider stated softball will be starting.

Commissioner Henry stated the Planning and Zoning met with the Commissioners and Attorney Leslie to clarify some details of the proposed Animal Control Ordinance.

Commissioner Bennett stated Historical Commission will meet next week and they have two events scheduled in May. The 11th is a BBQ Chicken sale at the Hardware Store in Mardela Springs, and the 18th is a yard sale and community event at Cherry Beach.

Superintendant White stated Utility Services sent in an application to be signed for painting and cleaning of the water tower. They cleaned up trees on Ferry Street near the ballpark. The water line to the concession stand has been repaired but the pipes inside the stand froze over the winter and need to be repaired. He stated they will begin flushing hydrants this month. Also, he stated he would like to rent a roll off dumpster to cut up and remove the old boat at the water plant.

President Gosnell asked for public comments. Nancy Springer asked which areas are to be paved. Superintendant White stated on in the area of Taylor Street and Church Street, Church Street in the area of the Firehouse, Taylor Street in the area of Joe Morgan Road, and Water Street in the area of the Matyiko's home.

There were no other comments. Commissioner Bradley made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 7:56 pm.
