

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING  
MINUTES  
April 19, 2021**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bennett, Bradley, Henry, and Schneider, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Adkins, and Nancy Springer.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve the minutes from the April 5th meeting, which seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Bradley made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 5 and 6 which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

President Gosnell stated the sewer lateral has been replaced.

President Gosnell stated Carters Electric had installed a monitor on the solar panels and they removed it today. The results will be forthcoming.

President Gosnell stated he, Superintendent White, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, and Joe Mangini had a conference call with SERCAP to discuss funding options for Sewer Plant and I&I upgrade.

President Gosnell stated Larry Goslee will be repairing the cracked sidewalks on Church Street this week. Commissioner Henry suggested checking our building standards to see if they are current.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

President Gosnell stated Southern Corrosion called and will have the water tower exterior cleaned and painted next week. It will not need to be taken offline to do it. They will also be redoing the lettering and American Flag.

President Gosnell stated he received an email from Parks and Recreation President Mark Carroll with some concerns pertaining to Cherry Beach. There is graffiti on the pavilion floor. Fisherman complained their lines are getting caught in the trees on the beach when they cast. President Gosnell stated he could get the graffiti cleaned up. The beach area is not a designated fishing area, so he will have no fishing signs put up.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. Commissioner Schneider stated Parks and Recreation is promoting Earth Day activities. Clerk/Treasurer Schneider asked the Commissioners thoughts on reopening the Town Hall up to the public. After discussion, it was decided to reopen the Town Hall on Monday April 26<sup>th</sup>.

President Gosnell asked for public comment. Nancy Springer stated the Historical Commission is discussing ideas for a scaled back Heritage Day.

Commissioner Bradley made a motion to adjourn the Commissioners meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.
