

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES
June 17, 2019**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bennett, Bradley, Schneider, and Henry, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Adkins, Circuit Rider Joe Mangini. Residents Jean Cordrey and Nancy Springer were also present.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve the minutes from the June 3rd regular meeting. A second was made by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

President Gosnell held the final reading of 2019/2020 Fiscal Year Budget Ordinance #93. Clerk/Treasurer Schneider read Ordinance #93. There were no comments from the Commissioners or public. Commissioner Bradley made a motion to adopt the 2019/2020 Fiscal Year Budget Ordinance #93, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell held the final reading of Sharptown Animal Ordinance #94. Clerk/Treasurer Schneider read Ordinance #94. There were no comments from the Commissioners or public. Commissioner Bennett made a motion to adopt Sharptown Animal Control Ordinance #94, which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor, so carried.

Circuit Rider Joe Mangini reported the application for the grant to acquire the old elementary school has been submitted. He stated the work had begun at Cherry Beach for the emergency grant the Town had received from DNR to replace the decking on the pier. Mr. Mangini stated he had not heard any updates on the grant application for the bulkhead. President Gosnell stated he had spoken to our Delegates, who said they would speak to officials in support of the project.

The Commissioners reviewed an invitation to the groundbreaking ceremony on June 19th at the “Home for a Hero” lot on State Street. A light lunch will be served at the American Legion.

President Gosnell stated the work on the pavilion at Cherry Beach is nearly complete.

President Gosnell asked Commissioner Schneider for clarification on how the process of reserving the Cherry Beach pavilion online would work. Commissioner Schneider stated he would get clarification at the Parks and Recreation meeting and report back.

The Commissioners discussed making changes to how water leak credit requests are handled. Clerk/Treasurer Schneider stated she would write up the changes and send to the Commissioners for their thoughts.

NEW BUSINESS:

President Gosnell stated town employee Roland Quenneville will be retiring at the end of July and will be moving to be closer to family. Roland has worked for the Town for many years, over different periods of time. The Commissioners discussed getting a gift for him. Clerk/Treasurer Schneider suggested a Visa gift card to help offset some of his travel and moving expenses. The Commissioners agreed. President Gosnell stated the Town has hired Chris Wolfe as a full time replacement. He will be attending classes to receive his water and wastewater operator licenses.

President Gosnell stated he had been thinking which areas need their sidewalks repaired or replaced and had an idea to apply for a grants to do sidewalk replacements on a block by block basis, and to pave the road in conjunction with the new sidewalks. Circuit Rider Mangini stated he would get Tracey Gordy's opinion on if it would be better to apply for block grants or sustainable community grants for that type of project.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. There were none.

President Gosnell asked for public comments. There were none.

Commissioner Bradley made a motion to adjourn the Commissioners meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 7:59pm.
