

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES
June 21, 2021**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bennett, Bradley, Henry, and Schneider, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Adkins, and several residents.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to approve the minutes from the June 7th meeting, which seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Henry made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5 which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor, so carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

Clerk/Treasurer Schneider read Sharptown FY 21/22 Budget Ordinance #96. President Gosnell asked for any comments, there were none. Commissioner Schneider made a motion to adopt Sharptown FY 21/22 Budget Ordinance #96, which was seconded by Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell stated as recommended by Jason Loar from DBF, he spoke to Hebron Savings Bank about a line of credit to use until the American Rescue Plan funds are dispersed. After discussion, Commissioner Schneider made a motion to approve President Gosnell and Clerk/Treasurer Schneider to sign for a line of credit in the amount of \$275,000.00 from Hebron Savings Bank, with the stipulation that it has a fixed interest rate. Commissioner Bennett seconded the motion. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell stated the valve on Joe Morgan Road has been replaced.

President Gosnell stated the Shore Health System will be having a COVID-19 vaccine clinic at Cherry Beach on August 13th and September 3rd from 4-8pm.

NEW BUSINESS:

President Gosnell stated the Town Hall will be closed on Monday July 5th in observance of Independence Day, the next meeting will be held July 6th.

Clerk/Treasurer Schneider reported the detail from a Zoom conference call regarding the American Rescue Plan. The State of Maryland has received the funds from the Federal Government and will be dispersed to the Municipalities by July 15th.

President Gosnell stated the Churches asked to close Cemetery Street on July 11th to 15th for VBS. Commissioner Schneider made a motion to approve the request to close Cemetery Street, which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor, so carried.

The Commissioners discussed Juneteenth being designated a Federal Holiday.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. Commissioner Schneider stated Parks and Recreation is still working on fireworks for Heritage Day. Commissioner Bennett stated Historical Commission is working on the Heritage Day planning.

President Gosnell asked for public comment. There was none.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to adjourn the Commissioners meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 7:53p.m.
