

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES
June 21, 2022**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bradley, Bennett, Henry, and Schneider, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Adkins, and members of the public.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve the minutes from the June 6th regular meeting, which seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5 which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor, so carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

President Gosnell stated a public hearing for the proposed 2022/2023FY Budget Ordinance #98 was held prior to the start of the regular Commissioners meeting. Clerk/Treasurer Schneider read aloud 2022/2023FY Budget Ordinance #98. There were no comments from the Commissioners or the public. Commissioner Schneider made a motion to adopt 2022/2023FY Budget Ordinance #98, which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell stated Larry Goslee has started the sidewalk replacement project on Railway Street. He stated Commissioner Bennett has heard comments from the public asking why the sidewalk in front of the Mt. Vernon parsonage house was not included in the project. President Gosnell stated he spoke with the Attorney who said that a change order could be added to the project without needing to re-bid out the project. Larry Goslee have given a price of \$7000 to replace the additional 115 feet of sidewalk in front of the parsonage. Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve the change order of \$7000.00 from Larry Goslee to include the sidewalk in front of the parsonage in the sidewalk replacement project, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

President Gosnell stated Wicomico County has updated the Hazard Mitigation and Resilience Plan. Clerk/Treasurer Schneider read aloud Resolution #2022-06. There were no comments. Commissioner Bradley made a motion to adopt Hazard Mitigation and Resilience Plan Resolution #2022-06, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioner comments. Commissioner Schneider asked if political signs were allowed to be on Town owned property.

Parks and Recreation President Mark Carroll stated the prices he found for the hanging style trash cans was \$280. He stated he would get prices on other styles as well.

June 25th is Family Fun Day at Cope Bennett Park and the Artisan Market at Cherry Beach.

Commissioner Bennett stated the Historical Commission has started moving things out of the building and will be looking soon to get volunteers to move the big stuff to the Town Hall.

President Gosnell asked for public comment. Leslie Podlaszewski, 503 Taylor Street, asked if the County could be contacted to clean out the drainage ditch behind her house. President Gosnell will discuss with the County.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to adjourn the Commissioners meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 7:56p.m.
