

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES
July 6, 2021**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bennett, Henry, and Schneider, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Adkins, and several residents. Commissioner Bradley was absent.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to approve the minutes from the June 21st Budget Ordinance Public Hearing, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Henry made a motion to approve the minutes from the June 21st regular meeting, which seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5 which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

The Commissioners read an update from Superintendent White concerning the status of the sewer plant project.

President Gosnell stated Baskar from DNR would be meeting with Mary Phipps from MDE on July 15th regarding the bulk head project.

Clerk/Treasurer Schneider reported the Line of Credit would have a fixed interest rate of 3.26 percent, with good credit.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Commissioners discussed what types of signs are needed for Cherry Beach. President Gosnell stated he may be able to get some signs from the County.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. Commissioner Schneider and Parks and Recreation President Mark Carroll reported on Parks and Recreation. Spray paint in the pavilion has been cleaned up. The Commissioners discussed if online fundraising/donations are permissible.

Commissioner Bennett shared a flyer from a “clean up” day in Mardela Springs and will look into costs for Sharptown to do something similar. Planning for Heritage Day is ongoing.

President Gosnell asked for public comment. Resident Nancy Springer stated she has seen a child/children driving a golf cart around Town even though the legal age to drive one is 16. We will post something online to remind the public of that.

Resident Jean Cordrey asked questions about the fireworks on Heritage Day and spoke about peoples complaining about the Post Office.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to adjourn the Commissioners meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 8:09p.m.
