

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES
August 3, 2020**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Henry, Schneider, Bennett, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Adkins, Joe Mangini, and resident Nancy Springer. Commissioner Bradley was absent.

Commissioner Henry made a motion to approve the minutes from the July 6th meeting, which seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4, 5, and 6 which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

Circuit Rider Joe Mangini reported he and President Gosnell met with Bhaskar from DNR to discuss the scope of work and the next steps of the shoreline restoration project. The project is not projected to begin until April 2021.

President Gosnell and Circuit Rider Mangini will meet on August 6th at 502 Nanticoke Street to determine the scope of work so bid requests can be requested.

President Gosnell stated he had a meeting scheduled with Southern Corrosion to discuss water tower maintenance but he has to reschedule due to the impending hurricane.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Commissioners received a request from 303 Cemetery Street for partial reimbursement of a plumbing bill. The sewer line was clogged and he called a plumber to look at it. The sewer line runs unusually and was clogged on the Town's side of the line. The Town had to call in help from Fruitland to get the line cleared. The total bill was \$424. The resident stated he would pay the \$99 dispatch fee and requested \$325 be refunded to him or credited to his water & sewer bill because the blockage was on the Town side. Commissioner Schneider made a motion to grant the request to credit \$325 to the water & sewer bill and to request in the future to call the Town Hall first, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

Resident Al Remsnyder requested to be on the agenda but was not in attendance of the meeting.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. President Gosnell stated the leaking fire hydrant on Main Street will be replaced. He also stated the Town received a letter from MDE about the ongoing BOD and TSS violation issues at the sewer plant. Jason Loar from DBF is drafting a response.

Commissioner Bennett stated he spoke with Rick Huey from Verizon about the issue of snakes in the tree stump. Mr. Huey stated the stump is not on Verizon property. The property adjacent belongs to the Fire Department but they believe it's not on their property. Attorney Mike Mathers suggested using the MERLIN GIS map to try to determine whose property it is on.

Commissioner Bennett also stated the Historical Commission would be having the Christmas tree lighting since it is an outdoor event but may not have the refreshments afterwards.

President Gosnell stated the Board of Appeals approved a request from 508 State Street to construct a 3000 square foot pole building/garage on his back lot, addressed 509 Cemetery Street.

President Gosnell asked for public comment. There were none.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to adjourn the Commissioners meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 7:47p.m.
