

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES
August 6, 2018**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bradley, and Henry, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Adkins, Attorney Mike Mathers, Circuit Rider Joe Mangini, and resident Jean Cordrey. Commissioners Bennett and Schneider were absent.

Commissioner Henry made a motion to approve the minutes from the July 16th regular meeting. A second was made by Commissioner Bradley. All were in favor and chair voted aye, so carried.

Commissioner Bradley made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor and chair voted aye, so carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

The Commissioners reviewed an update from Aaron Goller on Pecan Corner. Kirk Kinnamon and Parker & Associates have been contacted for a timeline on finishing the sidewalks. Incomplete plans were submitted to DBF, and Mr. Kinnamon is following up with Parker to get an update.

The solar project is ready for closeout. The system is producing an average of 99kw per hour, which is fairly efficient for the 110kw system.

President Gosnell stated production of the fuel tank for the generator project is delayed approximately 12 weeks due to high demand. Tentatively the new generator will be installed in October.

Circuit Rider Joe Mangini updated the Commissioners on his activities. He scheduled a meeting with Steve Disharoon on August 8th to discuss the Historical Commission museum building. Also, he and President Gosnell will meet with MDE on August 9th to discuss the bulk head.

NEW BUSINESS:

President Gosnell stated he has contacted Senator Eckhardt to arrange a meeting with MDE and State Highway Administration to discuss the cutting of the ditches around the bypass, and the safety concerns now with the increased traffic due to the Dollar General opening.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. Commissioner Henry stated Planning and Zoning met and is working on an ordinance to address the keeping on poultry, fowl, and other animals in town limits.

President Gosnell asked for public comments. There were none.

There were no other comments, Commissioner Bradley made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor and chair voted aye, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 7:54pm.
