

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING  
MINUTES  
September 8, 2020**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Schneider, Henry, Bennett, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Adkins, Attorney Mike Mathers, Mike Marvel from the State Highway Administration, and Ryan Lucy from Southern Corrosion. Commissioner Bradley was absent.

Commissioner Henry made a motion to approve the minutes from the August 17<sup>th</sup> meeting, which seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5 which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell introduced Mike Marvel from the State Highway Administration. Mr. Marvel proposed to the Commissioners that the SHA store road salt in storage containers on the Water Plant property. Storing the salt in Sharptown would prevent the SHA road crews from having to go back to their offices to refill the salt trucks. Also, the Town would be able to use the salt for our streets as well. Mr. Marvel presented site plan drawings of two proposed places on the property to place the storage containers. The Commissioners will review the drawings and get back with SHA with a decision.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

President Gosnell stated there were no updates to report on from the Circuit Rider Joe Mangini.

Ryan Lucy from Southern Corrosion presented the Commissioners with a contract for water tower maintenance for them to review. He stated the contract could be signed now with a post-dated start date. The Commissioners will have a work session on September 30<sup>th</sup> at 7pm to discuss the proposal from SHA and the contract from Southern Corrosion.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

The Commissioners received a request from the Historical Commissioner to approve Rachel Carroll as a new member. Commissioner Schneider made a motion to approve the appointment of Rachel Carroll to the Historical Commissioner which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell asked for Commissioners comments. Commissioner Bennett stated although Heritage Day was cancelled people are still interested in having yard sales that day, September 19<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioner Henry asked if any decisions had been made about Halloween. Commissioner Schneider stated Parks and Recreation would be discussing that at their next meeting. Commissioner Gosnell recommended following the guidelines/suggestions.

President Gosnell stated vandals knocked over the portable toilets at Cherry Beach over the weekend. Parks and Recreation members Mark Carroll and Scott McMahon cleaned up the best they could. The emergency number was called but they would not send out anyone to clean it up on a Sunday. They did send someone on Monday. Commissioner Schneider stated Mark Carroll asked if Parks and Recreation Commission could press charges or does the Commissioners have to press charges? Attorney Mathers will research that and get back with an answer.

President Gosnell asked for public comment. There were none.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to adjourn the Commissioners meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All were in favor, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 8:28p.m.
