

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES
April 15, 2024**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Henry, Schneider, Bradley, Bennett, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Secretary Manes, Wicomico County Sheriff's Department Captain Rich Wiersberg and Mark Carroll.

The Pledge of Allegiance was performed.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to approve the minutes from the previous meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All agreed, so carried.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to pay the bills as stated on page 4, which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All agreed, so carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

Circuit Rider Mangini reported that Senator Van Hollen's office has received our grant application. We are just waiting on clearance from USDA, then Van Hollen's office can move forward.

The annual town-wide clean-up day is scheduled for Saturday, April 20th, 2024 from 8:00 am until 12:00 pm. Two dumpsters from Shore Waste will be dropped off at the water plant on Friday afternoon and will be picked up again on Monday.

President Gosnell stated that the ceremony for Ms. Dot's bench dedication and Jefferson Award presentation was well attended and was really nice.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Town received a letter from MDE to pay the wastewater violation fine, which was originally \$30,000.00. MDE has offered to settle for the amount of \$24,000.00.

President Gosnell asked if there were any Commissioner comments.

Commissioner Henry asked if paving would be done around the manhole on Main street. There is currently a large dip there. President Gosnell said that it will be fixed.

Commissioner Bennett asked if the Town was interested in having a CPR class for the Commissioners, Town employees, and the committee representatives. There is interest and Commissioner Bennett will set it up.

Commissioner Bradley reported that the Historical Commission is currently working on the on-loan paperwork for the P.T. White to send to the Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum. The Museum stated the plans will be scanned into a database so they can be view world-wide and before they deteriorate any further.

Commissioner Henry stated that there was a good turnout for the Catfish Tournament. There were forty-seven (47) boats registered.

President Gosnell asked for any public comments.

Mark Carroll reported that softball and adult kickball has started. Vienna is getting a team together so we can play them. He also stated that he has a meeting with a Musco representative regarding field lighting at Gene Lowe.

Captain Rich Wiersberg of the Wicomico County Sheriff's Office reported that Sharptown had 42 calls for service between January and March.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to adjourn the Commissioners meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All agreed, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 7:57 p.m.
