

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES
May 6, 2024**

President Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:30p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Henry, Schneider, Bennett, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Superintendent White, Secretary Manes, Attorney Witz, Nancy Springer and Mark Carroll.

The Pledge of Allegiance was performed.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to approve the minutes from the previous meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All agreed, so carried.

Commissioner Henry made a motion to pay the bills as stated on page 4, which was seconded by Commissioner Schneider. All agreed, so carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

Circuit Rider Mangini reported that the Ferry Street/DNR Project, the Water Meter/SERCAP Project, and the Old School have no new updates.

The annual town-wide clean-up day went well. The weather was ok and 1 and ½ dumpsters were filled.

President Gosnell stated that he has not heard back from Houck regarding what day the paving is scheduled to begin.

Mark Carroll updated the Commissioners on the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) meeting. The draft that the County sent over was mostly reasonable, with only a few changes that need to be made. Commissioner Schneider explained that the MOU included both Gene Lowe Park and Cope Bennett Park because we should have one for both and that is what the County wants.

President Gosnell reminded the Commissioners of the upcoming work session regarding the cannabis ordinance.

NEW BUSINESS:

Letters were sent asking for Town Trash Collection bids. We received one (1) bid back from Chesapeake Waste. Commissioner Schneider made a motion to accept the Chesapeake Waste Proposal, with a second from Commissioner Henry. All agreed, so carried.

There were no Commissioner comments.

Attorney Witz stated that she would be on leave for the next few months and that Attorney Michael Mathers would be filling in for her.

Superintendent White reported that he has completed the Spring rental inspections. He also reported that the flows at the sewer plant have finally gone below 200,000 gal/day and that repair work has begun on the boat dock.

President Gosnell asked for any public comments. There were none.

Commissioner Schneider made a motion to adjourn the Commissioners meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All agreed, so carried.

President Gosnell adjourned the meeting at 7:48 p.m.
