

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING  
MINUTES  
March 16, 2026**

President Schneider called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bennett, Henry, Bradley and Carroll. Also present were, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Assistant Clerk/Treasurer Jennifer Horowitz, Jim Adkins, and Nancy Springer

The Pledge of Allegiance was performed.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve the minutes from the previous meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Henry. All agreed, so carried.

Commissioner Carroll made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5 which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All agreed, so carried.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

Circuit Rider Mangini reported via email that all applications and letters of support have been submitted for the \$500,000.00 Congressional grant for the old school. He reported that he also applied for the Community Legacy grant as well.

Attorney Witz advised the Town to write an ordinance regarding no parking signage as well as a no parking on street rule. The Wicomico County Sheriff's Department will enforce the ordinance.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

The Town is waiting to receive an updated quote for the street repairs that will take place on Main Street, Taylor Street, and Fourth Street.

The Town has received two (2) proposals from the water meter project suppliers. Currently, we are in the process of having our questions answered by the companies.

ADU Zoning requires the Town to have an ordinance in place by October 1, 2026. Planning and Zoning will need to meet to discuss.

Maryland Municipal League (MML) asked that in support of House Bill 1142, to please write a Resolution in support, rather than a letter of support. HB1142 - Form a task force which explores revenue structure of county and municipal governments within the State and submit the findings. The Commissioners agreed to do a Resolution in support.

The company that responded about providing us two (2) dumpsters for Town Clean-Up Day on April 18, 2026 was Shore Waste. We have used them in subsequent years. The cost that was quoted

was \$250.00 per dumpster and \$110.00 per ton. Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve the dumpsters with a second from Commissioner Bradley. All agreed, so carried.

The representative's names for Sharptown Recreation and Parks was submitted to all of the Commissioners. All were approved with the exception of one person who asked to not be a representative any longer. Commissioner Henry made a motion to accept the names, with a second from Commissioner Bradley. All agreed, so carried.

Nancy Springer announced a Bake Sale for Historical Commission on May 9, 2026. It will also include Morning Darlin Coffee and goods from Salt & Honey. She also announced that on May 16, 2026 there will be a speaker, Charles Paparella, to talk about the history of our area.

Jim Adkins reported that the Wicomico County Council voted down the West Side Task Force.

Commissioner Bradley made a motion to adjourn the meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All agreed, so carried.

President Schneider adjourned the meeting at 8:02 p.m.
