

**SHARPTOWN REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES
April 20, 2026**

President Schneider called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. In attendance were Commissioners Bennett, Henry, Bradley and Carroll. Also present were, Clerk/Treasurer Schneider, Assistant Clerk/Treasurer Horowitz, Secretary Favinger, and Wicomico County Councilman James Winn.

The Pledge of Allegiance was performed.

Commissioner Henry made a motion to approve the minutes from the previous meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Bennett. All agreed, so carried.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to pay the bills as stated on pages 4 and 5 which was seconded by Commissioner Bradley. All agreed, so carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

Circuit Rider Mangini reported via email that he met with Lucas Lees from Unity Landscape about the Living Shoreline and he will be doing the design work. He will design a living shoreline behind the rip rap in hopes that DNR will fund most of the project, with Wicomico County funding the rest. Once it gets approved, he can get started within 45 days.

He also reported that Pittsville notified DHCD of their intent to participate in the Town Manager/Circuit Rider program as the sponsoring agency and will be sending letters to Sharptown and Willards regarding the program.

President Schneider reported that after Attorney Witz reviewed the Arcola contract, it has been signed.

NEW BUSINESS:

Assistant Clerk/Treasurer did the second reading of the Water Meter Ordinance #102. Commissioner Bennett made a motion to accept Water Meter Ordinance #102, with a second by Commissioner Henry. All agreed, so carried.

President Schneider stated that Wicomico Westside Regional Wastewater System will be built to improve wastewater management on the west side of the County. There has also been a Waste Water Technical Advisory Board established by the County Executive to oversee the project.

The Sharptown Planning & Zoning Commission is scheduled to meet April 28, 2026 at 7:00 pm regarding the Accessory Dwelling Unit bill that has passed from the State.

Councilman Winn stated that the Town can apply to the County for Capital Improvement grants. He also stated that the County is waiting on one (1) study from the State regarding fixing the Barron Creek Bridge.

Commissioner Bennett announced that the Historical Commission will be holding a bake sale here at Town Hall on May 8, 2026 from 8:00 am - 11:00 am. They will also be having speaker Charles Paparella coming on May 16, 2026 to talk about history.

Commissioner Bradley made a motion to adjourn the meeting, which was seconded by Commissioner Carroll. All agreed, so carried.

President Schneider adjourned the meeting at 7:47 p.m.
